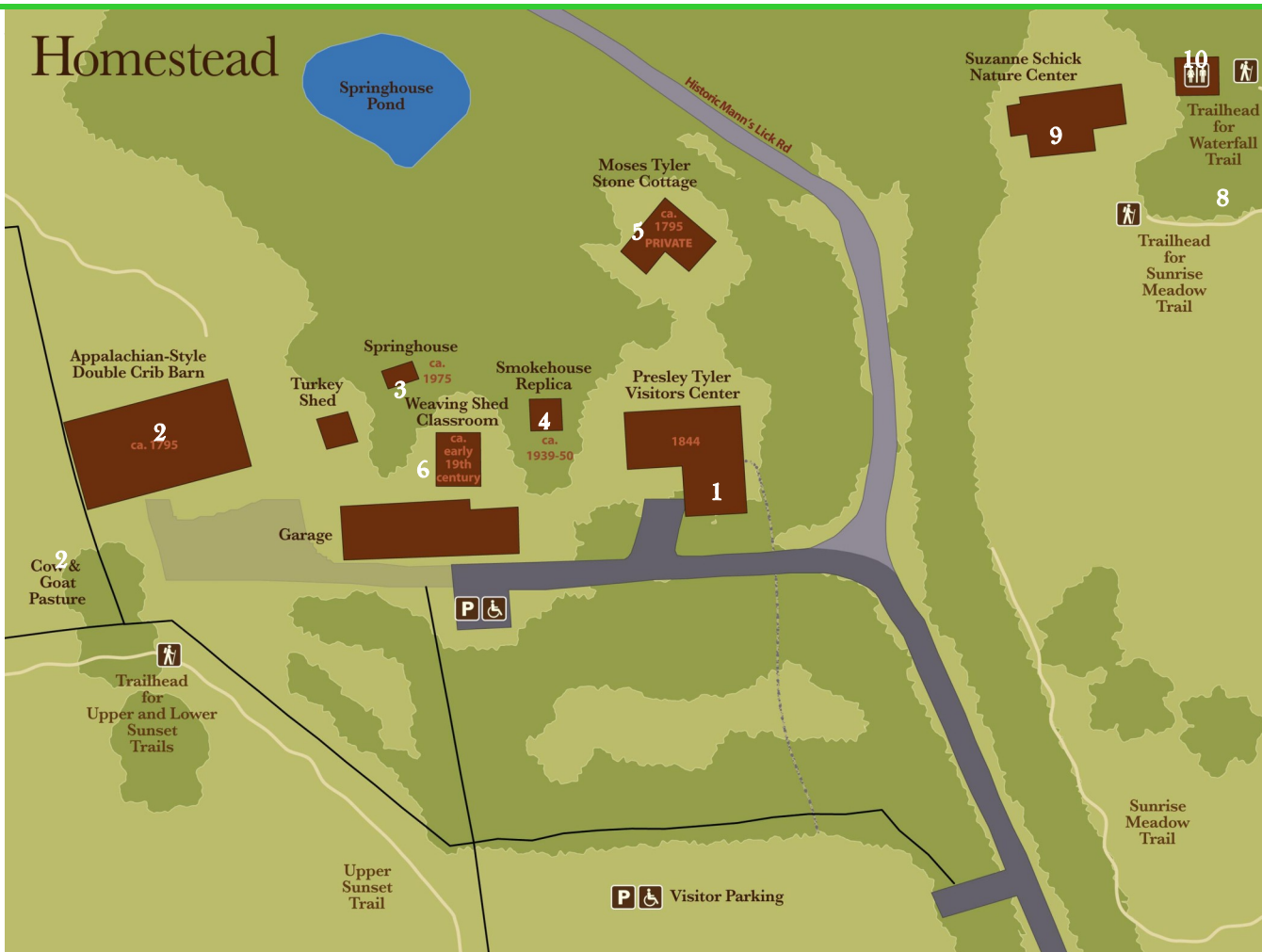


# Homestead



**1. The Presley Tyler House:** built in 1844, the **Presley Tyler House** was home to Presley and Jane Tyler and their ten children. A photo exhibit spanning more than 100 years of life at Blackacre is open

**2. Barn and Pasture Land:** an Appalachian style double crib barn, built in 1795. The “dog run” in the middle was for wagons, and hay and grain were stored in

**3. Springhouse:** built in the 1790’s over a spring and used to preserve food. The many springs on this prop-

**4. Smokehouse:** built in the 1950’s, the smokehouse was originally built of logs and used for smoking and

**5. Moses Tyler Stone Cottage:** built in the 1795 and now a private residence.

**6. Weaving Shed (6) and Suzanne Schick Nature Center (8):** used for the JCPS environmental studies classes and Black-

**7. Walking Trails:** six trails wind through pastures, fields, woodlands and the watershed.

**Informational kiosks** are located near the homestead parking lot as well as at the **Waterfall Trailhead (8)** near the **Nature Center (9)**.

### 10. Restrooms

Restrooms are available next to the Nature Center at the **Waterfall Trailhead**.

### General Admission

Free, but donations are encouraged. Donation boxes are located in the kiosk in the parking area and in the **Presley Tyler**
